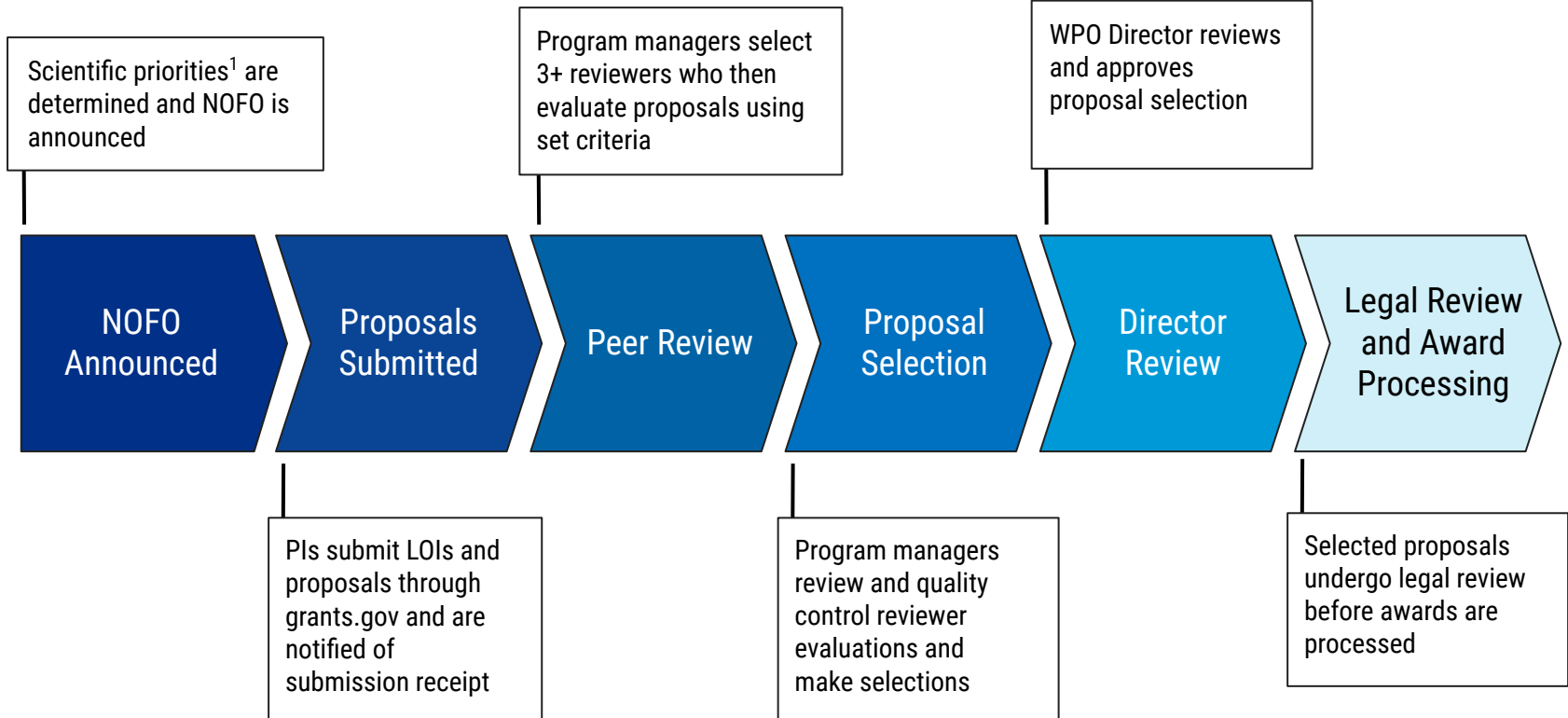

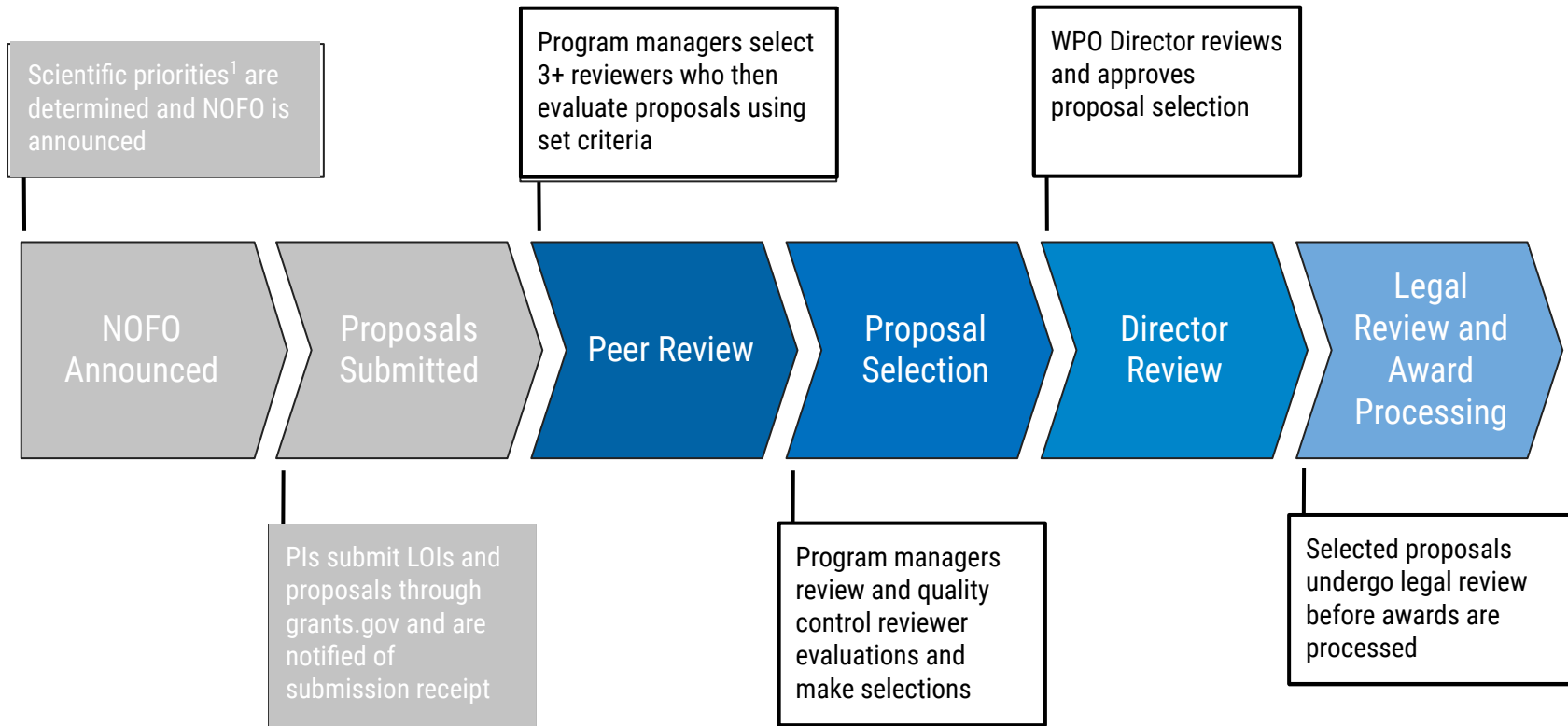

WPO NOFO PROCESS SUMMARY

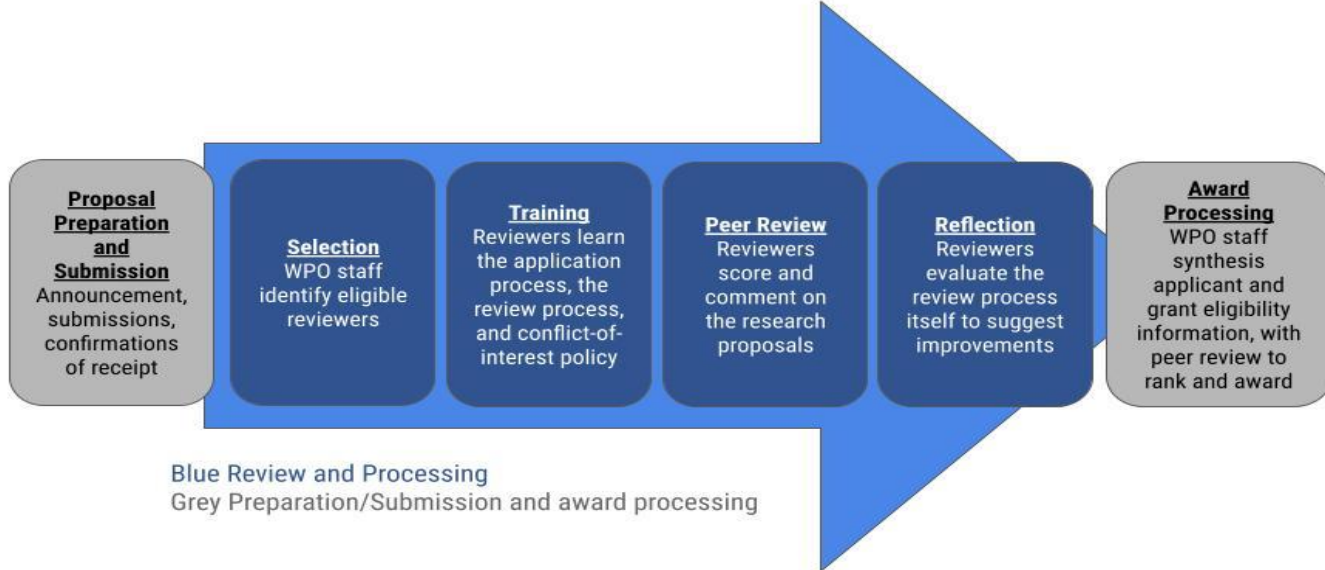


WPO NOFO AWARD PROCESS SUMMARY



GRANT PROPOSAL REVIEWERS

- Each Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) that the Weather Program Office (WPO) publishes requires a thorough peer review. If you would like to serve as a reviewer, please fill out the [Reviewer Application Form](#) and submit your resume to info.wpo@noaa.gov.

NOFO PEER REVIEW

Each application meeting minimum requirements is reviewed against all other proposals submitted to the competition.

Reviews are conducted by a panel of at least three peers, whose scores are averaged. Reviews will be quality controlled for equity and impartiality.



Note: Proposals may be selected out of rank order depending on funding availability and program priorities.

1 Relevance to Program Goals (30 pts)

2 Scientific & Technical Merit (30 pts)

3 Qualifications of Applicants (14 pts)

4 Project Cost (10 pts)

5 Education & Outreach (8 pts)

6 Diversity & Inclusion (8 pts)

AWARD REVIEW and PROCESSING

- After peer review, the WPO director reviews and approves final list of proposals.
- Selected proposals go through legal review by the Federal Assistance Law Division (FALD).
- Awards are processed by the NOAA Acquisitions and Grants Office (AGO) and distributed by the Grants Management Division (GMD) to recipients.
- Competition Managers will continue to work with recipients throughout the life-cycle of the grant.
