

## **Getting Started Guide**

Open Science and Public Access to Research Results



**Purpose:** As a recipient of NOAA Weather Program Office (WPO) funding, <u>you are required</u> to comply with NOAA's Public Access to Research Results (PARR) policy and embrace Open Science principles. This ensures your research outputs are discoverable, accessible, and preserved for the public and scientific community.

At Award Start:	Complete?
Review Open Science Requirements: Participate in your Program Kickoff Meeting to receive an overview of the Open Science and PARR requirements for your award, ask questions, and confirm you understand your responsibilities from the start.	
<b>Obtain Individual Persistent Identifier:</b> Register for a free, unique, persistent identifier at ORCID.org or review and update your existing profile. Using your ORCID ensures proper attribution of your work and helps NOAA track research outputs efficiently.	
<b>Bookmark the PART Program Website:</b> Access all templates, guidance, and examples for meeting Open Science and PARR requirements. Keep this page handy for quick reference throughout your project.	
<b>Plan for Human-Subject Data:</b> If your project involves collecting data from people, engage early with your Institutional Review Board (IRB), library, and institutional repository to discuss data-sharing plans. You may need to update your consent form language to reflect any intent to make data publicly available.	
Plan Where to Deposit Outputs: Review the NOAA Repository Guidance to decide where you will archive data, data instruments, and code for public access. Choosing repositories early will streamline compliance and ensure timely sharing.	
Before Publishing / Presenting	Complete?
Acknowledge WPO Funding: Include your award number in all research outputs (publications, datasets, code, presentations, etc.). Use this standard language:  "This research was supported by NOAA Weather Program Office ( <a href="https://ror.org/01q70bz83">https://ror.org/01q70bz83</a> ), Award [Award Number]. Data and code are available at [Repository Link] per NOAA PARR policy."	

Deposit Manuscripts/Reports in NOAA's Institutional Repository: Submit all award-related peer-reviewed articles (post-refereed author manuscript if not open access; final OA version if open access) and NOAA technical reports/memoranda to the NOAA IR.  How to Submit: Email <a href="mailto:noaa.repository@noaa.gov">noaa.gov</a> with the publication citation, award number, and CC <a href="mailto:part.wpo@noaa.gov">part.wpo@noaa.gov</a> . Attach the manuscript (post-referred if not an open access journal) or final Open Access version.	
During Your Award	Complete?
Share Research Outputs at Semi-Annual Reviews: Use the Open Science slides in your Program's Semi-Annual Review template to research outputs released in the past six months. This ensures WPO stays informed of your latest outputs and compliance with PARR requirements.	
At Award Closeout:	Complete?
Confirm All Outputs Have Been Shared: Confirm that all award-related publications, datasets, code, and other outputs are reported at your final semi-annual review and documented in the final RPPR (and deposited in required repositories).
